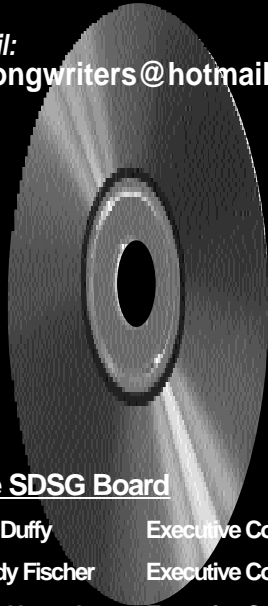

Our next "Country" pitch guest, Jim Casey of Power Diamond Music, has recent cuts with Matchbox 20 and Cheryl Crow. And, demonstrating the rule that proves the exception, Power Diamond also has a cut with Dolly Parton, emphasizing the fact that, as much as people in the music business live and die by categorization, barriers between genres are permeable. Think again about your best songs, you know, the ones that are "Rock" or "Pop" or whatever. Are they suitable for crossover into a style that you never imagined?

In July, we hosted an outstanding pitch opportunity with Todd Kern of Network Music. Todd picked up several of our writers' songs for further consideration, and helped us all better understand the world of Production Music. If you didn't attend this session you missed hearing some excellent submissions by our members. I know Todd was impressed with the level of writing and production he heard. I was impressed with Todd's solid feedback and willingness to listen to *a lot* of music. It takes endurance to make it in this business!

Please don't ever miss a session just because you don't have anything to pitch. As an SDSG member, you can attend any session as an observer for free. Come for the education, the camaraderie and the inspiration.

SDSG Pitch Session September 23, 7PM

Power Diamond Music Publishing is located at 1900 Wedgewood, on Nashville's Music Row. Founded in 1998, Power Diamond Music (BMI) and Diamond 88 Music (ASCAP), also represent catalogs of Sun Records founder, Sam Phillips, including Hi-Lo Music, Knox Music and Charles Rich Music.

The Power Diamond staff includes: Jim Casey, owner and Head of Nashville Operations, Jerry Phillips, owner and head of Memphis and Muscle Shoals operations, Know Phillips, owner and Director of International Relations, Dottie Rager, Nashville Creative Director, and Matt Casey, Nashville Studio Engineer. Recent major label cuts have come from artists MatchBox 20, Dolly Parton, and Cheryl Crow.

In addition to music publishing, a live weekly radio show "THE POWER DIAMOND REPORT" is aired digitally from the Power Diamond Music Building to WXFL-FM "KIX 96", a 50,000 WATT R&R Reporter in Muscle Shoals, Alabama. "KIX 96" is currently the Arbitron rated number one country music station in the Shoals market.

This year, Power Diamond re-established the "Midnight Sun Records" label, a sister label to the legendary Sun Records label. Midnight Sun was acquired as a delivery vehicle for establishing new artists. The first artist release for the label is Sonny George, Nashville Country Rock-a-Billy artist who is currently touring Europe.

Jim Casey, head of Nashville Operations, came to Nashville as an artist and writer for Allen Reynolds, Dickey Lee, and Jack Clement. His writing includes Country cuts for Bobby Bare, Sammi Smith, The Oak Ridge Boys, Waylon Jennings, and Charlie Pride, along with pop records on Ritchie Havens, The Smoke Ring, and bluesman, Albert Collins. He is active in producing, writing, as well as publishing.

Registration opens at 6:30 PM. The meeting begins at 7:00. A maximum of two submissions per writer or team of writers will be allowed at each session. Pitch fees are \$10 per submission. Non-members may attend sessions as observers for \$20.00. For general information and rules on pitch sessions, see page six of this issue of Songwriters Notes. Pitches are open to SDSG members only but, as always, SDSG memberships are available at the sessions. Annual dues are \$45.00.

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PRODUCERS, PUBLISHERS, A&R REPRESENTATIVES, MANAGERS and ARTISTS may screen for a specific recording project. They use these events to find songs, singers, musicians, etc. Our guests may critique your song and give you valuable feedback on how you could improve upon it if time permits. The guest may "pick-up" your song which means they would like to hear it again for further consideration.

Submission Rules

- We reserve the right to limit the number of tapes submitted by an individual in any event. This right applies equally to those members submitting tapes by mail. We ask that writers number their tapes, #1 being your first choice, #2 your second, so that we may play them according to your priorities.
- Due to time limits, we cannot guarantee that your song will be heard in the Pitch Session.

Fees

- For the submission price of \$10 per song (limit 1 to 2 songs per writer, varies with guests), you may enter your song(s) for the Pitch Session. Members may sign up songs in advance.
- You may join The San Diego Songwriters Guild on the night of an event for a \$45 yearly membership fee.
- Non-members are charged a \$20 door fee. Only SDSG members may pitch songs.

How It Works

- Bring neatly typed lyric sheet and CD or cassette cued to the beginning of the song you want heard.
- Tapes will not be accepted for the Pitch Session after the start of the event.
- Be sure to include your name and phone number on both your lyric sheet and your tape or CD because they may get separated.
- The Pitch Session is limited to 70 tunes. Once event is filled, sign up is closed, even if the event has not started. SDSG reserves the right to limit the number of submissions further.
- When you check in your song, sign in all names of writers, song title and phone number, so that others who hear your song can contact you.
- Submissions will be referred to by song title. Writers may or may not remain anonymous during the Pitch session depending on our guest for that event.

Join the San Diego Songwriters Guild. Membership dues are \$45.00 annually.

Timely renewals are \$40.00 per year.

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TAXI A Member's Perspective *by Joan Kurland*

So you've been plugging away as a songwriter for a long time and you've come up with a couple of real gems. You've got a ballad that would be perfect for Celine Dion or a kick-ass country tune that you just know Garth Brooks would love. There's only one problem: how do you get your material NEAR these superstars? You know darned well that unsolicited tapes usually end up in some secretary's garbage can.

Enter TAXI, the "Independent A & R Vehicle." This LA-based organization aims to hook up prominent music industry people with songwriters who wouldn't normally be able to get their material heard.

TAXI works like this: members pay an annual fee to receive a newsletter twice a month with dozens of listings like, "Director of A&R at major label looking for mid and uptempo Pop/R&B songs a la Mariah Carey/Toni Braxton for a new female artist" or "Major Nashville label looking for dog and cat songs to accompany a book of photos of Nashville stars with their pets." TAXI hires industry pros to screen the submissions so that only the best stuff gets forwarded. If your material is right-on for the listing, you get a chance to get it to the people in power. If it's not, you get a professional critique sent back to you.

TAXI charges \$300 to join, \$200/year thereafter, but offers \$50 discounts to SDSG members when they join TAXI. Tell TAXI that SDSG sent you- it pays! **TAXI.com 800-458-2111**

Bug Music visits with SDSG Sept 9

Since 1975, Bug Music has blazed a distinguished trail as one of the world's leading publishing administrators. From country and blues to electronica and pop, chart toppers and indie rockers, Bug has it all. What appeals to Bug's offbeat assortment of clients is not only Bug's profile - "real small, real street, real alternative" but the bottom line that Bug is not a publisher, strictly speaking, but a publishing administrator. The distinction is crucial. Publishers acquire copyrights, invest in them, and exploit them. Administrators handle the paperwork, licensing, royalty collections, etc. for independent copyright owners, usually very small publishers or the songwriter his or herself. Publishing administrators, of which Bug Music may be the only true example, combine the two.

Here's a list of a few of the projects that Bug's Eddie Gomez currently seeking songs for:

- Jessica Andrews: Looking for undeniable Hit singles only. This is Country/Pop with depth. Her vocals are very strong and convincing and the material should be as well.
- Whitney Houston: Looking for one or two more big ballads reminiscent of her earlier material.
- Bro,Sis: This is the group that won the German TV version of "Popstars." The line-up is 2 girls & 4 boys. They've already had a national #1 single. Seeking R&B/Hip-Hop songs w/ English lyrics.
- Martina McBride: They are seeking songs similar to her Evolution album. Songs that really showcase the purity & power of her voice. A nice blending of Country meets Pop.
- Toni Braxton: Soul R&B/Dance that,s done w/ Toni,s signature vocal style that exudes both maturity & sensuality. She usually covers a lot of ballads & midtempo dance songs.
- Vanessa Amorosi: Australian born singer-songwriter who has already enjoyed huge success with her debut album which yielded 4 hit singles! Still looking for smash hits. Classy, uptempo Pop with anthemic choruses.
- Shawn Kane: A new artist who sounds like a 2002 Sam Cooke meets Otis Redding. This is a high priority for the label. They are looking for soulful songs in the style of Jodeci.
- Jessi Alexander: She's been co-writing with the likes of Benmont Tench & Gary Nicholson, who is also producing her record along with Mark Wright. Needs material that has a Blues or a soulful type of Country edge to it.
- The Jenkins: A new trio that features a mother and her two daughters. They are looking for traditional Country meets Americana type songs.
- TLC: The surviving members intend to complete the album that they had started before the untimely death of Lisa "Lefteye" Lopes. This group has always pushed the boundaries with their brand of R&B that incorporates Pop elements. Catchy hooks, bouncy funk with a sassy, sexy attitude.

Eddie advises that he is always looking for top-notch Pop, R&B & Country. He would consider doing a "one-off" deal if he came across what he felt was a "hit" song, but mostly Eddie looks for writers or "potential" writers that legitimately have a need for an administrator.

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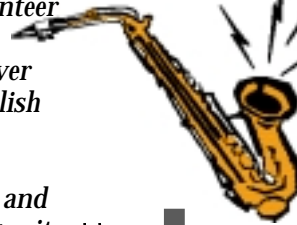
THE SAN DIEGO SONGWRITERS GUILD
